

A step-free route from Horse Guards Parade to Westminster Station

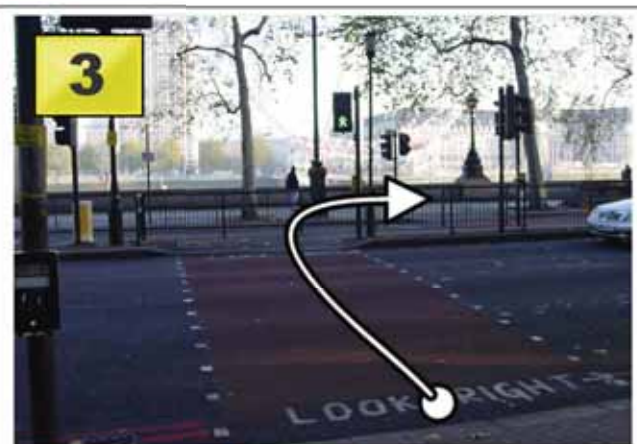
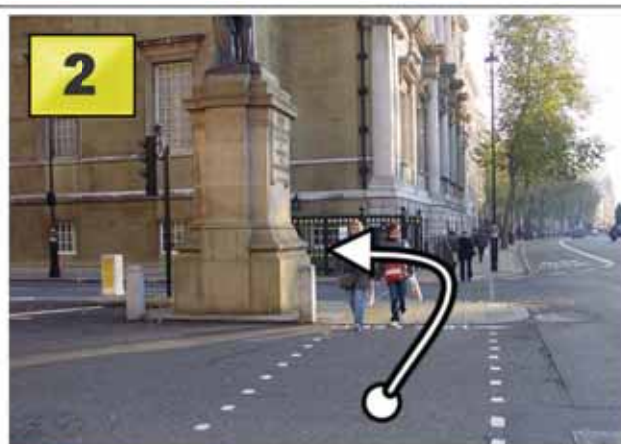
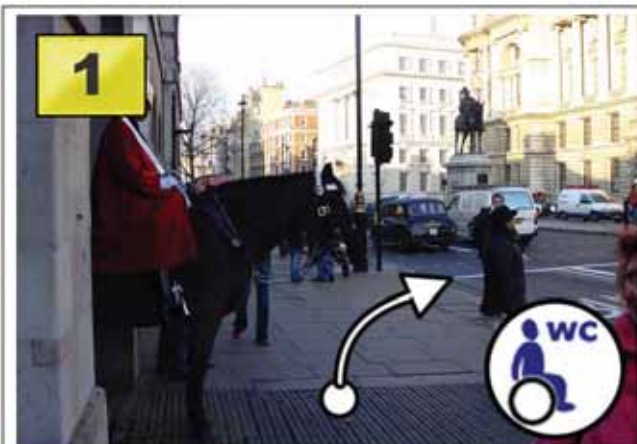
This map takes you from the changing of the Guard at Horse Guard's Parade to Westminster Underground station.

This journey is around 960 metres long. It should take around 12 minutes to finish. If you have difficulty getting about it could take around 32 minutes.

Under each picture is a time-bar to show you how long you need to walk to finish the journey.

 = the length of travel for each part of the journey.

 = the length of travel already completed.



From the courtyard - go through Horse Guards **Building** and **cross** the road (Whitehall).

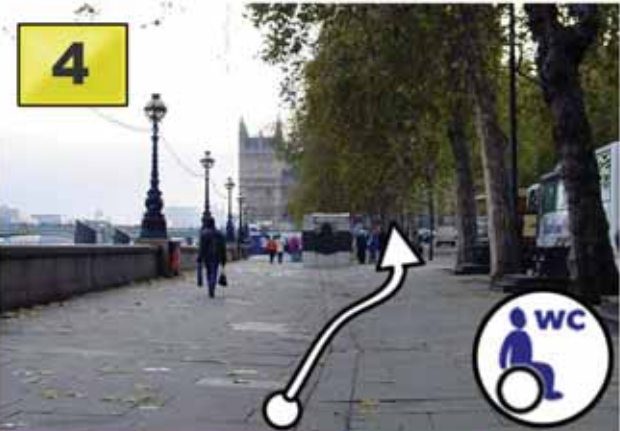


Turn right and **cross** the next road (Horse Guards Avenue). Go along this road.



At the **end** of the road cross over to **go alongside** the river (or you can stay on the same side).

Further along the riverside the level splits - **stay on the upper level.** (There are seats along this road.)

Turn right and cross the pelican crossings **at the end of the road.** This gets quite busy.

Keep going **along Bridge Street** to Westminster Station.

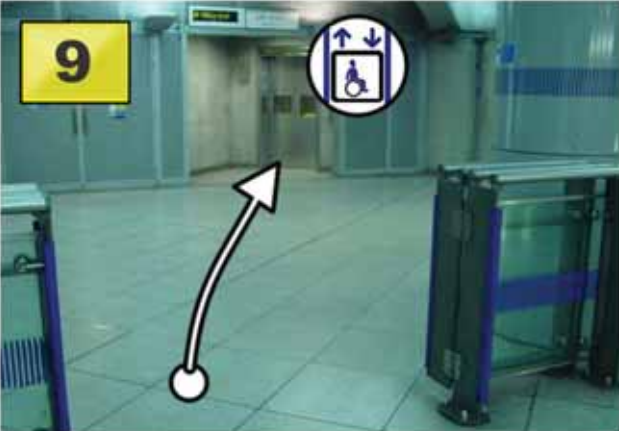
On the **left of the station entrance** is a **lift to the Ticket Office.**

Go through the ticket barriers. On your **right is the 2nd lift** - take the lift **to the next level down.**

From the lift **turn left to the 3rd lift.** Take the lift **down to the platform.**



From the lift **turn right towards** the platforms.
