

# A step-free route from the London Eye to the National Film Theatre



This map takes you to the National Film Theatre, showing mainstream and independent films every day. It is at the heart of London's South Bank Centre.

This journey is around 400 metres long. It should take around 5 minutes to finish.

If you have difficulty getting about it could take around 15 minutes. (These figures are estimates only)

Below each picture is a time-bar. These can show you how long you need to walk to finish the journey.

 = the length of travel for each part of the journey  = the length of travel already completed



Go **right** at the front of the **London Eye** (towards the Waterloo Millennium Pier).



**Follow the riverside** – it's a **long walk** but with lots of **seats on the way**. The pavement is really **wide and flat**.



Go **under the Golden Jubilee Bridges**.

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You pass some cafés and shops on the right.



Further along the riverside is a book market under a bridge. On the right is the National Film Theatre. There is a cobbled walkway in front of the entrance.

Accessible toilets: 2 at the London Eye.  
Cafés: 2 Cafe Manga coffee shops, 1 inside the Ticket Hall and 1 outside.



Places to eat (with accessible toilets): Giraffe (☎ 020 7928 2004); Strada (☎ 020 7401 9126); Wagamama (☎ 020 7021 0877); Eat (☎ 020 7401 2989). The ramp with rails to this level is at the end of the line of shops.
